Spares with knight

Practices himself with quintain

Rides into battle with knight

Obedience Week 2

- Research in the encyclopedia, books, or online to find out **becoming knight duties**.

Keeps vigil

Prays and fasts all night

Dresses in red for blood, white for purity, brown for earth at death

Dubbed with king's sword

Promises to come to aid of his lord when called and to defend the church, women, and orphans

Receives sword and spurs

Lays weapons on the altar
