Orderliness Week 1

- Describe a spider in one stand alone sentence...
"Spiders are arthropods and like all arthropods have an exoskeleton or hard shell replacing their bones, but unlike the rest of the arthropods, spiders have the unique ability to produce and spin webs of silk for the purpose of catching their prey."
- Use series to add information
- Use vivid verbs, specific nouns along with descriptive adjectives to build each sentence
- Hammer out each sentence
- Put something in a category to identify
- Contrast one organism with another organism
- Use phrases to add information.

Orderliness Week 2

Tuesday

Insects communicate with each other by using chemicals called pheromones. Interrupt scent on ant trail and observe.

Follow a pheromone path. Have one child go on a specific path through the house, spraying air freshener. Other children follow scent blindfolded.

Find and catch insects today. Kill and mount.

Catch a grasshopper and find his spiracles.

Catch insects at night around porch light. Explain why they are attracted to light. Determine what insects are attracted to light.

Research lobster, crabs, shrimp, crayfish that are Arthropods in crustacean class.

Define crustacean.

Dissect a crayfish and find gills.

De-vein the shrimp. Tell what are you removing.

Research barnacles, where they live, how they eat, and why they are a problem for ships.

Suggestions for Dad

Orderliness Week 2

- Give out vocabulary words.
- Take kids fishing or to the creek to catch crayfish, frogs, toads, turtles, snakes, minnows or other "creek creatures" that are coming up in next week's study.
- Enlist the aid of your children to put something in order...the tool shed, the attic, the flower beds, the lawn, etc. Create a team attitude!
