Decorating the Hall

Obedience Week 4

- Use the shields, coat of arms, and tapestries to decorate the hall.
- Decorate with greenery and garlands down tables and on walls.
- Fresh cedar or pine give the hall a festive smell.
- Use many, many candles.

Table Settings

Obedience Week 4

- Set up tables in a U or T shape.
- Cover tables in sheet and create runners from fabric remnant.
- Each table needs candles, spices in bowls to flavor meat and puddings (dried basil/mustard and cinnamon/sugar).
- Each guest gets a trencher, napkin, knife, and glass.

Making a Boar's Head

Obedience Week 4

- Using 3-5 lbs. (we recommend 5 lbs. or else the head looks like a softball with a snout), shape a boar's head with fat jowls out of meat loaf mixture.
- Cover ears with aluminum foil.
- Add apple in mouth, crab apples eye sockets, olive eye pupils, and curled celery tusk after cooking.

Teaching Poise and Projection

Obedience Week 4

Give your children the gift of being able to speak in front of groups.

- Know lines well.
- Project voice to the back of the room.
- Use big hand motions.
- Look out at audience.
- Mom serves as prompter.

Protocol at the Feast

Obedience Week 4

- Surveyor shout to guest, "Wassail, wassail leavu freond! Welcome, welcome, good cheer dear friends."
- Sing Wassailing song.
- Surveyor presents salt to guest at high table.
- Surveyor summons pantler to bring bread.
- Pantler slices off upper crust to most honored guest.
- Page carries aquamanile to each guest to wash hands.
- Begin the feast intersperse meal courses with entertainment.
- End feast by reciting Philippians 2:9-11 and singing a hymn.
- Collect leftovers for the poor.
- Blow horn to signal the end of the feast.

15 th Century Table Manners

Obedience Week 4

- Eat food with hands and knife (no forks or spoons for individuals).
- No spitting.
- No picking teeth.
- Rise when giving a toast to host.

- Teach **Scripture verses**.
- Dress **yourself for Medieval Feast**
