Writing Tips

Orderliness Week 7

- Process not Product
- Read poems to get the idea of poetry
- Focus on flower words:
 - sprout, reach, stretch, flutter, nod, dance, pluck
 - bees, showers, butterflies, blossom, buds, scent
- Teach poetic devices:
 - simile-a comparison of unlike objects using *like* or *as*
 - metaphor-a comparison of unlike objects without using *like* or *as*
 - personification-a figure of speech where poet gives human qualities to an animal or an object

Sequoia/Redwood Facts

Orderliness Week 7

- Belongs to the cypress family
- Three species:
 - Coast Redwoods 2,200 yrs. and 379 ft. tall
 - California Redwoods
 - Sequoia 3,200 yrs. and 311 ft. tall
- One of the oldest living trees on earth
- One of the fastest-growing trees
- Ropey bark, 1-2 ft. thick resists fire and insect
- Root system shallow and wide
- Grow naturally on western slope of Sierra Nevada in CA
- Fog important to growth
- Reproduce sexually (seeds in cones) and asexually (burl)
- Needle foliage
